# PCORI Preventing tipping points in high comorbidity patients: A lifeline from health coaches

The RCT will compare the outcomes of 1960 patients randomized in clusters by Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) within networks to either: 1) the Patient-Centered Medical Home as implemented by FQHCs); or 2) the FQHC Patient-Centered Home plus a coaching intervention by a lay Health Coach that employs a positive affect/self-affirmation intervention, not tied to specific chronic conditions, to help motivate patients to learn to implement self-management by setting life goals.
