





The mission of the Health Equity Research Fellowship at Weill Cornell Medicine and Hunter College is to train investigators for academic careers in primary care, hospital medicine, global health, and health services research.

This innovative mentored research fellowship focuses on physicians, nurses, and PhDs who aim to become extramurally funded independent researchers.

Our program is uniquely designed to deepen trainees' understanding of health care, local and international healthcare delivery systems, epidemiology of disease, and interventions to improve health outcomes. We offer four focus areas and they are Primary Care, Health System Redesign, Community-Partnered Research, and Global Health.

Program Features

- Two to three-year fellowship duration depending on prior training and experience
- Tailored one-on-one faculty mentorship from a multidisciplinary team of faculty at Weill Cornell Medicine, Cornell University, and Hunter College
- Master of Science degree in Clinical Epidemiology and Health Services Research based in the Weill Cornell Graduate School of Medical Sciences for trainees without prior formal training
- Vibrant, supportive environment created by our Cornell Center for Health Equity
- Competitive salary and benefits



Eligibility

Eligible applicants have an MD, DO, DNP, PsyD, PharmD, MBBS, MB ChB, or PhD with a strong commitment to becoming scientists. Clinicians must have completed clinical training. Applicants with prior research experience or with a Masters or PhD in addition to their clinical degree are encouraged to apply; the program can be adapted to provide them with more advanced training. US citizens or Permanent Residents only.
