Primary Care Innovation (PCI) Program

On May 27, 2021, the PCI program hosted the 4th **Annual Primary Care & Hospital Medicine Innovations Symposium** virtually with over 200 guests in attendance nationally. This year the PCI program provided \$175,000 to fund 11 innovative interdisciplinary projects across campus, consisting of 8 faculty, 1 resident, and 2 student awardees in various topics related to primary care (click here for a complete list of recipients and project titles). The half-day symposium began with opening remarks from Dr. Fred Pelzman, Dean Augustine Choi, and Dr. Judy Tung. This year the program featured a new format—two prominent keynote speakers—Andrea Cherrington, MD, Professor for Division of Preventive Medicine at the University of Alabama Birmingham, and Robert Wachter, MD, Professor and Chair of the Department of Medicine at





the University of California, San Francisco. A panel discussion with keynote speakers was then moderated by **Dr. Monika Safford** on the subject of *Reflections on* Primary Care & Hospital Medicine in the Current State. Other event highlights included past competitive seed grant presentations, abstract presentations, and compelling poster sessions from abstracts selected during an open call for abstracts earlier this year. This year's event showcased posters from medical students, residents, fellows, and faculty from WCM, NYP, Global Health, Pediatrics, Internal Medicine, and ITS. The event concluded with closing remarks and a raffle giveaway from Dr. Monika Safford. The symposium was a forum to get to know others with similar interests and to become familiar with the ongoing innovative work oncampus and off-campus in the Primary Care arena.

Cornell Center for Health Equity (CCHEq)

In April, the Cornell Center for Health Equity (CCHEq) sent out a request for collaborative, novel, and innovative applications for one-year project grants. We are delighted to highlight this year's 2021 CCHEq Collaborative Pilot Projects recipients. CCHEq annually sponsors collaborative pilot projects that support research to achieve health equity and, by consequence, investigates several issues pertaining to health disparities and social justice.

The 2021 recipients are **Dr. Eloise Chapman-Davis**, project entitled "Use of a Web-based Platform (Patient Activated Learning System) to Promote Knowledge, Uptake and Completion of HPV Vaccination in the Era of COVID" was funded \$50,000. **Dr. Tashara Leak** and **Dr. Marisa Censani**, project entitled "Addressing Type 2 Diabetes Mellitus Disparities Among Low-Income Households with Adolescents Using a Novel Telehealth Lifestyle Intervention" was funded \$50,000. **Drs. Aditya Vashistha**, **David Scales** and **Antonio DeRosa**, project entitled "Supporting Community Health Workers in Fighting COVID-19 Misinformation in Low-Resource Environments" was funded \$50,000. **Dr. Onyinye Balogun** and **Dr. Amelia Greiner Safi**, project entitled

"Centering the Marginalized Voices of Black Patients with Gynecological Cancer as a First Step in Healthcare Curriculum Development" was funded \$5,000.

Diversity Center of Excellence (DCoE)

The Diversity Center of Excellence continued the year with educational initiatives from April through June. DCoE provided administrative support to Black and Latino Men in Medicine (BLMiM), which concluded an 8-week virtual mentorship program, Science and Leadership in Medicine (SLiM), for 111 students on April 25. BLMiM also hosted its annual conference on May 1, which also concluded the college's annual Diversity Week. The Pre-Medical Initiatives led by Dr. Andrea **Card** hosted three Dialogues in Health sessions for over 60 linkage students in April. The Faculty Development Circles, an initiative co-hosted with the Office of Diversity and Inclusion, welcomed 18 faculty participants for Cohort 3, including GIM faculty Dr. Sean Pickering and Dr. Ugochi Nwosu. Faculty, trainees, and medical students part of the Diversity Mentoring Cascade participated in the last virtual session on May 4 with guest presenter Dr. Kamia Sarraf, who presented a session on Restoration and Growth: Moving Beyond the Trauma of Times Like These. The DCoE also hosted an end-of-the-year celebration and welcome for the new interns with the Department of Medicine and the Minority Housestaff Committee (MHC) on June 14. It was a lovely in-person event with remarks from Dr. Susana Morales, Dr. Kirana Gudi, Dr. Anthony **Hollenberg**, and the co-chairs of the MHC, Dr. Aiya Aboubakr, Dr. Lindsay Clarke, Dr. Elizabeth Sanchez, and Dr. Fabian Vargas. We thank Anita Mesi for her years of outstanding service, commitment, and dedication to the Division of General Internal Medicine during her tenure. The division experienced substantial growth and success








under Anita's exceptional management and leadership. We wish her all the best in her new role!
