Weill Cornell Medical Center was chosen as a pilot site for the National Academy of Medicine's <u>Action Collaborative on Combatting Substance Use and Opioid Crises</u>.

For the second year, the <u>PALS</u> is partnering with the Public Health Communication Course (VTPEH 6184) for Fall 2024. Four Cornell MPH students are collaborating with GIM physician-scientists to create health education articles on Diabetes. This includes reviewing literature, synthesizing articles for healthcare professionals, and developing patient-facing materials at a 6th-grade reading level, complete with visuals, soundbites, and assessment questions.

Patient Education

A new four-week hybrid course (MEDC 8187) is available to students focused on addressing health disparities and improving access to health information through the Patient Activated Learning System (PALS). Students will review peer-reviewed literature, learn to communicate complex medical information at a 6th-grade reading level, and apply educational theories to enhance patient education and promote health equity.
