

**Assistant Professor of Clinical Medicine
Division of Pulmonary and Critical Care Medicine**

Academic Position Summary:

- The Division of Pulmonary and Critical Care Medicine in the Weill Department of Medicine at NewYork-Presbyterian/Weill Cornell Medical Center is seeking an academic board certified/board eligible pulmonary and critical care trained physician to join our distinguished faculty. The Division is recognized nationally for providing advanced clinical care, conducting pioneering research, offering unique teaching opportunities, and demonstrating commitment to improving the health status of the community we serve. Clinician educators are sought at all career levels; we offer protected time to pursue academic interests in teaching, policy, advocacy, and research for highly qualified candidates.
- Weill Cornell Medicine (WCM) is the medical school of Cornell University. Faculty members have clinical appointments at NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital (NYPH), one of the largest and most comprehensive academic medical centers in the nation and one of New York City's top-ranked hospitals.

Academic Responsibilities:

- This clinical position may include a mix of inpatient and outpatient duties, including sessions in the Medical Intensive Care Unit (MICU), including night coverage, the inpatient pulmonary consultative service, and our busy office practice at several locations. Faculty work closely with medical students, residents, and fellows, providing opportunities for teaching and academic development.
- Weekend and/or holiday service as an attending physician on the inpatient MICU service or general pulmonary inpatient consultation service commensurate with peers. The MICU is staffed by a faculty member overnight who works closely with the in-house fellow.

Medical Education Requirements:

- Candidates must maintain an M.D. or comparable foreign medical degree
- Certification by the American Board of Internal Medicine (ABIM) in Internal Medicine and board eligible/ or board certified in Pulmonary Medicine and/or Critical Care Medicine
- A valid and active New York State medical license

Academic Appointment Requirements:

- Assistant Professor of Medicine candidates will have completed pulmonary and critical care medicine fellowship within the past 4-6 years.

Clinical Appointment Requirements:

- Appointment as an Assistant Attending Physician of NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital (NYPH) will be contingent upon approval of the WCM academic appointment. Hospital attending and/or consultation privileges will be limited to WCM and NYP-Lower Manhattan Hospital, unless otherwise specifically agreed to in writing by the Medical

College Dean.

Professional Licenses and Certifications:

- A valid New York State medical license, DEA license, board certification, and all applicable certification and/or credentialing specific to the medical specialty; must meet the qualifications to enroll and participate in all third-party payer insurance plan credentialing.

Competencies:

- Must remain compliant with all WCM and NYPH initiatives, including completion of the WCM academic annual self- assessment and completion of NYPH annual ongoing professional peer evaluation.

Compensation and Benefits:

- We offer highly competitive and excellent benefits, including 403B, malpractice coverage (including tail coverage), LTD and life insurance, and tuition reimbursement for qualified employees and dependents.
- Rank commensurate with experience.
