Hospital attending and/or consultation privileges will be limited to WCM and NewYorkPresbyterian Lower Manhattan Hospital, unless agreed to in writing by the Medical College Dean.

applicable certification and/or credentialling specific to the medical specialty; must meet
the qualifications to enroll and participate in all third-party payer insurance plan
credentialing.
