Academic Position Summary:

- The Division of Nephrology and Hypertension at NewYork-Presbyterian/Weill Cornell Medical Center seeks a transplant nephrologist dedicated to providing compassionate, evidence-based clinical care; the successful candidate will also teach fellows and medical students committed to the advancement of the field of transplantation
- Successful candidates will have an M.D. with ABIM certification in Nephrology; hold or be eligible for a New York state medical license; and will have specialized training in transplantation nephrology. Additional experience in transplantation nephrology is welcome.
- Our transplant program is a large volume, state-of-the-art kidney transplant program with a longstanding history of being a leader in the field. The program has innovative approaches to immunosuppressive protocols, monitoring of transplant recipients, and transplantation of candidates with challenging medical and immunological conditions.
- Weill Cornell Medicine (WCM) is the medical school of Cornell University. Faculty members have clinical appointments at NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital (NYPH), one of the largest and most comprehensive academic medical centers in the nation and one of New York City's top-ranked hospitals.

Academic Responsibilities:

- This clinical position includes duties consisting in the management of inpatient kidney transplant service, outpatient evaluation and care of kidney/pancreas transplant candidates and recipients, transplant education, community outreach, participation in transplant quality assurance and improvement processes, and engagement in clinical and/or translational research
- Engage in research activities contributing to the field of nephrology, including obtaining independent funding for research activities
- Weekend and/or holiday service as an attending physician on the inpatient service commensurate with peers.

Medical Education Requirements:

- Candidates must maintain an M.D or comparable foreign medical degree
- Certification by the American Board of Internal Medicine (ABIM) in nephrology and critical care nephrology
- A valid and active medical license in the state you wish to practice

Academic Appointment Requirements:

- Academic rank of Instructor in Medicine typically includes 1-3 years of academic experience. Assistant Professor of Medicine typically includes 4-6 years of academic experience with first author scholarship related to the clinical field and teaching.
- Successful post-training candidates will have evidence of a strong, local reputation in the clinical field of nephrology and transplant nephrology, with a leadership and/or a key role in activities that include practice, such as approaches to diagnosis; treatment or prevention of disease (such as renal disorders, end stage renal disease and pancreas

transplant care)

Clinical Appointment Requirements:

- Appointment as an Assistant Attending Physician of NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital (NYPH) will be contingent upon approval of the WCM academic appointment. Hospital attending and/or consultation privileges will be limited to WCM and NYP-Lower Manhattan Hospital unless otherwise specifically agreed to in writing by Weill Cornell Medical College's Dean

Professional Licenses and Certifications:

- A valid New York State medical license, DEA license, board certification, and all applicable certification and/or credentialing specific to the medical specialty; must meet the qualifications to enroll and participate in all third-party payer insurance plan credentialing.

- Must remain compliant with all WCM and NYPH initiatives, to include completion of the WCM academic annual self- assessment and completion of NYPH annual ongoing professional peer evaluation

Compensation and Benefits:
