

**Assistant Professor of Medicine
Division of Nephrology & Hypertension**

Academic Position Summary:

- The Division of Nephrology and Hypertension at Weill Cornell Medicine, chaired by Dr. Manikkam Suthanthiran, seeks an energetic nephrologist dedicated to providing compassionate, evidence-based clinical care. The Weill Department of Medicine has the unique distinction of being home to a Hypertension Center of Excellence, once led by Dr. John Laragh, a pioneer in hypertension care, has made groundbreaking contributions to understanding the volume/vasoconstriction pathogenesis of hypertension and developing renin-angiotensin-aldosterone based therapeutics.
- Weill Cornell Medicine (WCM) is the medical school of Cornell University. Faculty members have clinical appointments at NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital (NYPH), one of the largest and most comprehensive academic medical centers in the nation and one of New York City's top-ranked hospitals.

Academic Responsibilities:

- Conduct 4- 6 sessions per week focusing on hypertension, including hypertension associated with various comorbidities/disorders such as kidney disease, kidney transplantation and dialysis; cardiovascular disease; and pregnancy.
- Train to become an expert in diagnosing and managing all forms of secondary hypertension, including renovascular hypertension, endocrine and adrenal hypertension (aldosterone, pheochromocytoma, Cushing's).
- Manage patients with chronic kidney disease
- Provide inpatient consultative service in general nephrology and hypertension
- Utilize expertise in Point-of-Care Ultrasound (POCUS) to enhance consultative nephrology and perform kidney biopsies at the bedside, particularly valuable for kidney allograft biopsies.
- Engage in research activities contributing to the field of nephrology including obtaining independent funding for research activities.
- Weekend and/or holiday service as an attending physician on the inpatient service commensurate with peers.

Medical Education Requirements:

- Candidates must maintain an M.D or comparable foreign medical degree
- Certification by the American Board of Internal Medicine (ABIM) in Nephrology
- Eligibility for New York state medical licensure

Academic Appointment Requirements:

- Academic rank of Assistant Professor of Medicine typically includes 4-6 years of academic experience with first author scholarship related to the clinical field and teaching.
- Successful post-training candidates will have evidence of a strong, local reputation in the clinical field of nephrology, with a leadership and/or a key role in activities that include practice, such as approaches to diagnosis; treatment or prevention of disease (such as renal disorders, end stage renal disease and pancreas transplant care)

Clinical Appointment Requirements:

- Appointment as an Assistant Attending Physician of NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital (NYPH) will be contingent upon approval of the WCM academic appointment. Hospital attending and/or consultation privileges will be limited to WCM and NYP-Lower Manhattan Hospital, unless otherwise specifically agreed to in writing by the Medical College Dean.

Professional Licenses and Certifications:

- A valid New York State medical license, DEA license, board certification, and all applicable certification and/or credentialing specific to the medical specialty; must meet the qualifications to enroll and participate in all third-party payer insurance plan credentialing.

Competencies:

- Must remain compliant with all WCM and NYPH initiatives, to include completion of the WCM academic annual self- assessment and completion of NYPH annual ongoing professional peer evaluation.

Compensation and Benefits:

- We offer highly competitive and excellent benefits, including 403B, CME, malpractice including tail coverage, LTD and life insurance, and tuition reimbursement for qualified employees and dependents.
- Rank commensurate with experience.
