

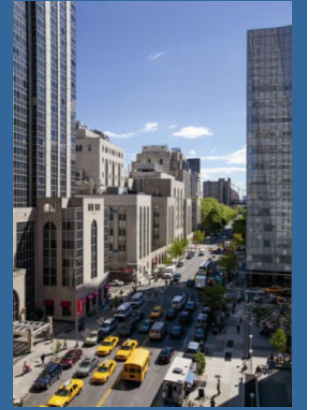

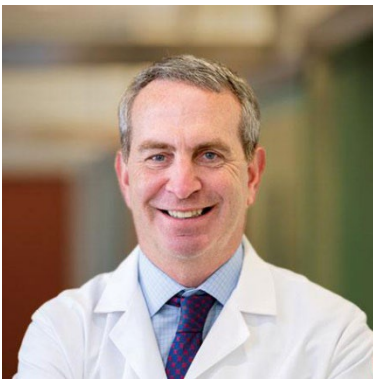

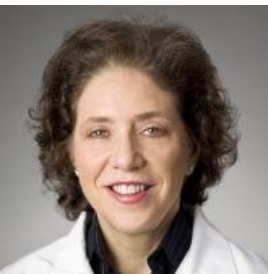
## **Drs. Fitzgerald and Rhee Receive \$5 Million TRAC Grant from the NIH**

## News Flashes

- **Dr. Roy M. Gulick**, Chief, Division of Infectious Diseases, was quoted in *The Washington Post* (July 15, 2022) in an article, "[Doctors treating monkeypox complain of 'daunting' paperwork, obstacles.](#)" Dr. Gulick, among other doctors dealing with increasing cases of monkeypox, report that there is a burdensome amount of paperwork and assessments to complete to obtain the necessary drug (Tpoxx) from the Strategic National Stockpile. Tpoxx is an antiviral approved to treat smallpox. (Smallpox is from the same family of viruses as monkeypox.) To date, Dr. Gulick and team have treated more than a dozen cases of monkeypox.
- Congrats to **Dr. Sri Lekha Tummalapalli**, Division of Nephrology and Hypertension, WDOM, on receiving a K08 grant awarded through The Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ). This grant, entitled "Impact of the ESRD Treatment Choices Model on Home Dialysis Uptake and Disparities," is focused on how a randomized nephrology payment policy influences the provision of dialysis care.
