
Announcements

Losing a particularly productive type of beta cell may contribute to the development of diabetes, according to a new study by Weill Cornell Medicine investigators.



The individual must have an established record of providing strong mentorship, as well as fostering a nurturing and supportive environment for all faculty. <u>Read More</u>



Election into the ASCI, which represents excellence across the breadth of academic medicine, is a milestone for physician-scientists. Innovations

The division of Pulmonary and Critical Care Medicine and the division of Thoracic Surgery are excited to announce its new **Interventional Pulmonology (IP) Service.** This service is intended to streamline and expedite the care of patients who may need advanced bronchoscopic or pleural interventions.

For IP consults for inpatients:

- Order a pulmonary consult in Epic. Under Orders, type "Inpatient Consult to Pulmonary" and choose WC Pulmonary Consult* in the dropdown.
 Note: If the appropriate team/location is located at LMH, the Transfer Center can arrange transport to the 68th street campus for the procedure under IP attending's name. If all discharge criteria are met, the patient will be transferred back to LMH. If necessary, the Transfer Center can also arrange the transfer to a bed and team if the patient needs to stay on 68th street after the procedure. This can be facilitated with the

assistance of the pulmonary procedure fellow.

Our team will route the consult to the appropriate IP physician on call. Our physicians are on-call 24/7.

For IP consults for outpatients:

 Order an ambulatory pulmonary referral in Epic. Under Orders, type "AMB Referral to Pulmonology " and, under reason for referral, choose Interventional Pulmonology in the dropdown.
